

Sports Premium Statement 2017-2018

Market Rasen C of E Primary

As at the start of the Financial Year (April 2017) the amount of Sports Premium Funding we expect to receive is £11,562. It has been mooted that this amount may be increased however this statement reports on guaranteed funding at the time of writing.

This year we intend to spend to spend the funding on:

Spend	Cost	Expected Impact	How will these improvements be sustainable
To pay for a P.E and extracurricular activities leader. To pay for extracurricular teaching.	£5000	The vast majority of children will attend one of the many (usually 20 per week) extra-curricular activities that we offer. Children will experience additional teaching and learning at the end of the school day. Children's health and fitness will improve.	Extra-curricular leader will build up a range of contacts and resources to run activities on an annual basis. Extra-curricular leader will be able to take on some of these activities in the future reducing the cost.
To enter into the Wolds Sports Partnership	£2,095	This allows the school to access training, local competitions and other benefits necessary to deliver high quality P.E. The impact will be that many of our children will be able to experience team and competitive sports.	Support for the Wolds Sports partnership will ensure that it receives the funding it needs to run into the future.
To pay for supply cover to attend training and competitions	£750	Staff will be able to attend P.E CPD. Children will be able to enter tournaments and competitions held in the school day.	Children who have experienced competitions will be more likely to attend them in the future; into secondary and beyond. Staff who attend CPD will be able to use this beyond this year.
Additional sporting and after school clubs.	£960	This allows us to offer additional after school clubs to improve health and fitness for our learners.	Equipment purchased will provide health and fitness activities for years to come.
To partially pay for new playground markings on the Mill Road playground.	£2757	Pupil voice told us that children wanted to have new playground markings on the Mill Road playground to improve health, fitness and wellbeing during recreation times. Sports premium funding was used to pay for a small proportion of this improvement. It is expected that the markings will make the children more active in recreation time and be a useful tool during P.E lessons.	The markings have a 10 year lifespan so hundreds of children will befit from them.
